





An Outreach Office took place in Manorhamilton during September.

### **Atlantic Economic Corridor Update:**

### **Regional Enterprise Development Fund: Creative Heartlands**

The project is continuing its programme of workshops. To date over 600 people have engaged in training under the programme across 60 workshops and €75,000 has been invested in equipment. Several enterprises have availed of the catalogue of film and deign equipment that is available. ### Northwest Regional Enterprise Plan Implementation

### Offshore Wind Regional development

September brought the 2<sup>nd</sup> working group meeting of the Northwest/West Wind energy group, with Leitrim as a key stakeholder due to high levels of onshore wind. Presentations to the group discussed the limitations of the electricity grid and the opportunities available in energy parks. Key focus areas ongoing are supply chain development, skills and regional opportunities.

### **NPF Submittal to Government**

In September, the NW REP submitted, in collaboration with Leitrim/Sligo/Donegal CoCo, a joint submittal to the government with a focus on how the status of infrastructure in the region is impacting on our enterprises ability to attract talent, investment and causing logistical issues. The NPF is a key infrastructure enabler.

### **NW Steering committee meeting**

A Steering Committee meeting was held in September with all regional bodies represented, including Leitrim CoCo/LEO.

### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

### LCDC

A meeting of the LAG took place on 18th September 2024. Six projects were approved funding.

### **Broadband**

Ongoing response to general queries re Broadband. Continuing to work with BCP's and our Kids Code to schedule kids coding workshops in the community. Planning for further Vex robotics workshops in the BCP's. Meeting of the Digital Steering group took place on Sept 18<sup>th</sup>.

### **Carrick Campus**

Ongoing promotion of the space available at Carrick Campus. New Show Office developed. New website at an advanced stage. A launch event is currently being organised.

### **Leitrim Diaspora Strategy**

Regular meetings are continuing regarding the execution of the Diaspora Strategy, presently focused on "The Leitrim Gathering" scheduled to take place in May 2025. Promotion of the event is ongoing. A funding call for community groups to apply for financial support to organise an event in their locality closes on 25<sup>th</sup> of October 2024. A new "Diaspora award" has been added to the Love Where You Live Awards, taking place on the 10<sup>th</sup> of October 2024.

### **Sustainable Mobility Projects**

A coffee morning was organised on the 27<sup>th</sup> of September to promote carpooling and sustainable transport methods for staff in Leitrim County Council.

### **SDG Week Events**

During Sustainable Development Goals week, a coffee morning promoting sustainable travel took place on the 27<sup>th</sup> of September for staff in Leitrim County Council. Three evenings of social cycling (on electric bikes) took place along the Shannon Blueway on the 24<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> of September.

### **Purple Flag**

Purple flag self-assessment took place on September 27<sup>th</sup> with preparation of the submission to ATCM ongoing in September.

### **Excellence in Local Government Awards 2024**

Leitrim County Council have been shortlisted for Excellence in Local Government Awards under Promoting Economic Development category for the acquisition and development of Carrick Business Campus.

### **TOURISM**

### Marketing

Leitrim Tourism CLG successfully applied for funding under the Leader program for two projects: a) A two-year marketing program to include Radio, TV, Video on Demand, PR, and online, and b) developing a visitor information app.

### **EU Project**

The Northern and Western Regional Assembly invited the tourism team to attend the 3rd Interregional Learning event of the Interreg Europe Green Health project in the Podkarpacie Region in Poland. The Ireland team included representatives from NWRA Eimer Dowd, Declan Meehan, Rural Recreation officer for Leitrim Emma O'Hagan and Tourism officer Leitrim County Council Sinead Mc Dermott. The event included presentations and shared experiences from partner counties on improving accessibility and inclusion when encouraging activities outdoors and the enjoyment and promotion of natural amenities.

### **Tourism Forum**

The tourism forum convened and discussed a challenging yet stable year with a trend for last-minute bookings. Subgroups submitted reports and actions from the framework document were discussed.

### **Slow Adventure**

Four new experiences have been developed and uploaded to the website <u>www.slowadvenutre.ie</u>. Videos and brochures will also be created for each experience and promoted through various channels.

### **Social Media**

All social media platforms—Instagram, Facebook, and X—were maintained throughout September, emphasising promoting festivals and events.

### **Acres Lake**

Minister Catherine Martin officially turned the sod on the new €1.2 million Water Sports Facility at Acres Lake, Drumshanbo, County Leitrim. Developed by Fáilte Ireland in partnership with Leitrim County Council. This best-in-class outdoor tourism amenity aims to enhance the visitor experience and serve as a central hub for outdoor activities in Leitrim.

The new Water Sports Facility at Acres Lake will help extend the outdoor tourism season by providing year-round hot showers, changing rooms, toilets, secure storage, induction spaces, and equipment washdown areas. Accessibility and sustainability will be key focus points for the project, ensuring full wheelchair access and installing solar heating panels to comply with 'Nearly Zero Energy Building Standards'. It will also feature Leitrim's first Changing Places facility along with an accessible toilet.

### **TOWN REGENERATION**

### Croi Conaithe - Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant

The Croí Cónaithe scheme was introduced to help bring vacant and derelict properties back into use as family homes and rental residential units. The Vacant Homes Officer of Leitrim County Council works closely with applicants to allow suitable properties to be brought back into productive use. To date 199 applications have been received, 86 have been received since January 2024, 16 Grants have been paid out to date.

### **Manorhamilton Town Centre First Plan**

The Town Regeneration office held an initial meeting with Manorhamilton Town Team to discuss the process of producing a Town Centre First Plan. The tender documents to procure a consultant for the development of a Town Centre First Plan for Manorhamilton, have been finalised during September and quotes will now be sought from a number of consultants.


### Kinlough, Dromahair & Ballinamore Town & Village Suite of Supports Funding

Minister Humphreys announced that Ballinamore, Dromahair and Kinlough were awarded €10,000 per town, under the Town Centre First, Town Team Support Fund. The funding may be used to support the establishment and/or development of town teams where they are not already well established, and to better understand the unique features of towns. During the month of September two meetings were held with Ballinamore Town Team and the formation of the Town Team is now at an advanced stage. An advertisement was placed in the Leitrim Observer to hold a public meeting for the establishment of Kinlough Town Team on Thursday, 03<sup>rd</sup> October 2024 in Kinlough Community Centre and it is hoped that a public meeting to set up a Dromahair Town Team, will also be advertised shortly.

### THRIVE - Town Centre First Heritage Revival Scheme - Application Strand 1

The purpose of the funding stream is to reduce vacancy and dereliction by creating a sustainable and viable reuse of Heritage buildings, in line with Town Centre First Approach. Leitrim County Council successfully secured funding under this scheme to carry out a feasibility study on the Town Hall Building in Carrick on Shannon to establish an end use for the building following widespread consultation process. The project is now at procurement stage and is currently going through evaluation.

There were 1 no. Local Authority own development proposals going through the public display phase of their Part 8 public consultation process during September, namely the creation of a school safe zone at St. Clare's National School, Manorhamilton by the Active Travel Department. 3 no. Part 8 Local Authority own developments were approved in September at their respective Municipal District meetings namely social housing proposals in Kiltyclogher and Ballinamore and an Active Travel scheme connecting Tully Heights to the footpath network in Ballinamore.

### Residential Zoned Land Tax (RZLT)

A total of four no. appeals were lodged with an Bord Pleanála regarding the decision taken by Leitrim County Council to include the lands in the RZLT maps published in February. All four appeals have now been determined by An Bord Pleanála with the Board upholding the inclusion of lands as being within scope in 3 appeals but set aside the determination of Leitrim County Council and excluded the lands from the RZLT map in Carrick-on-Shannon.

The Government outlined additional measures relating to the RZLT in Budget 2025 and Leitrim County Council await correspondence from the Minister of Housing, Local Government and Heritage to clarify the approach to be taken in relation to the inclusion of lands on the RZLT map on foot of this.

### **Heritage / Biodiversity**

- The O'Rourke's of Leitrim Heritage Audit and Interpretation Plan is progressing. The historical and archaeological research has been completed and a final project report is being prepared.
- The O'Rourke's of Leitrim Memory Map Project is live and the public are uploading material relating to the O'Rourke's.
- A Connecting Through Heritage Podcast Series is being developed, which will interview elderly Leitrim residents on particular heritage themes and places.
- The Leitrim Wetland Survey Phase III is complete, and the final report is being prepared.
- The Killahurk Ringfort Access, Environmental and Archaeological Assessment is complete, with final project reports submitted and funding recoupment claimed.
- The St Mogue's Abbey Community Monument Fund 2023/24 conservation project is underway.
- Local Authority Biodiversity Action Plan 2025 2030 Development of Discussion Paper for Biodiversity
  Action Plan and launch of pre-draft public consultation. Closing date for submissions is Friday 1<sup>st</sup>
  November.
- The second meeting of the *Biodiversity Working Group* took place in Carrick-on-Shannon and comprised of representatives from public bodies, environmental NGOs, farming organisations and community groups.

### **ROADS**

### **Pavement Overlays**

 N16 Pavement Overlay Scheme (POS) - Manorhamilton to Cornacloy Phase 1 – Final Account has been agreed with the Contractor. Change order to be submitted to TII regarding alterations to the contract. Final retention to be paid once safety file has been completed. • N4 Pavement Overlay Scheme – Carrick on Shannon – Consultants are currently working on the design and tender documents for this Pavement Overlay Scheme. Going forward this will be advertised for tender subject to TII approval. However, Consultants are also looking at additional drainage works required due to poor condition of storm drainage. Once detailed drainage design is completed, this pavement overlay scheme will be tendered.

### Realignment of N16

• Realignment of the N16 at Munakill – This scheme was at Phase 3 – Detailed Design and Environmental Assessment stage. It was being designed by RPS consultants and project managed by Westmeath National Road Design office (NRDO). However, this contract was recently terminated due to the fact that the cost estimate for the scheme has recently significantly increased due to poor ground conditions, and this presented a significant challenge to the progression of the project, as the scheme now exceeds the TII €20m threshold to qualify as a minor scheme. The infrastructure section of Leitrim County Council is currently working closely with Westmeath NRDO and the TII to examine all options in order to secure the progression of this realignment project.

### **Bridge rehabilitation works** – Works include:

- Bridge rehabilitation works have been substantially completed on 7 bridges
- Works ongoing to four other bridges.
- Contractors have been procured to construct two other bridges which are expected to be completed by the end of November (but will be dependent on contractor resources & weather conditions).

**Low Cost Safety Schemes** – Design works completed on some and submitted to Areas office. Design works ongoing on others.

### **Specific Improvement Grants**\_ - Works include:

- R289 Kilcoon Design Consultant tenders received and are being assessed.
- R280 Loughmurran Realignment

Options under consideration were presented at a Public Consultation Day held on the 20<sup>th of</sup> July 2023. A preferred option is currently being identified and the development of this option is progressing. Public Consultation on emerging preferred Option is fixed for the 7<sup>th</sup> November 2024.

### **Leitrim Village Flood Relief Scheme**

Ryan Hanley Consulting Engineers have been appointed for the scheme. Public Consultation was held for the scheme. Topo Surveys and Ground investigations are now complete, Environmental surveys, Hydrology and hydraulic analysis on this project on going. A preferred option is currently being identified and the development of this option is progressing.

The OPW have updated the flood maps for Mohill. The OPW Design Staff are currently carrying out hydrology and hydraulic analysis and economic feasibility on this project to determine the need/extent for flood defenses in Mohill.

### **Carrick on Shannon Public Regeneration Scheme**

Four construction contracts will be undertaken.

- Reconstruction of Footpaths and Roads Main Street/St George's Terrace/Approach roads
- Construction of Car Park at Flynn's Field
- Construction of Boardwalk along river edge
- Lighting of N4 Bridge and Boardwalk at Linear Park

All works are complete except Bridge and Boardwalk lighting contract. A substantial completion certificate has been issue for the Scheme.

### SLNCR Greenway - Sligo to Enniskillen

Aurp have been appointed as Design consultant for the project. Phase I - Concept and Feasibility of the project is complete. Phase II – Options selection stage is well under way. Public consultation of route options held from 23<sup>rd</sup> Oct 2023 to 17<sup>th</sup> Nov 2023. Full details on web site <a href="www.slncr-greenway.com">www.slncr-greenway.com</a>.

### Cavan Leitrim Greenway - Corgar to Aghawillin

Under construction. Expected completion is Q4 2024

### **Acres Lake Facility Centre**

Funding has been secured from Failte Ireland to construct a facility centre at Acres Lake, Drumshanbo. This will provide toilet facilities, shower facilities and a base for operators using the lake. Design consultant O'Connor Sutton Cronin has been appointed. Sammon Developments Ltd has now been appointed to construct the scheme; work has commenced on site.

Cluain Locha, Drumshanbo – works substantially complete.

Planning approval has been received for this project. Tenders for the Scheme have now been returned and are being assessed. Funding approval from ORIS for the construction contract has now been received.

Part 8 planning approval obtained at the September 2024 MD meeting.

### **OPW Minor Flood Schemes**

### **Dromahair Scheme**

A Feasibility Report was completed on the flooding situation in Dromahair by Tobin Consulting Engineers. This was submitted to the OPW with an application for funding to further develop the Minor Works scheme. Funding of €588,420 has been approved from the OPW to progress the design of the scheme.

Tobin Consulting Engineers were appointed in Q4 2023 to carry out assessment and concept design of possible flood alleviation measures along the river Bonet, current program is that we apply for planning consent to ABP in Q4 2024.

### Leitrim Village (Keadue Road Scheme) Scheme

Funding of €213,191 has been approved for a progress a temporary flood defence Scheme, to alleviate more frequent flooding at Clauin Oir housing estate Keadue Road, Leitrim Village. CST has been appointed as design consultant for the scheme. Part 8 Planning consent was received for the Scheme at the May 2024 MD meeting and a Contractor has now been appointed to construct the scheme.

### Manorhamilton Minor Works Scheme

Funding of €59,558 has been approved by OPW following a flash flood on the 22nd May 24, Works include clearing Vegetation on the Owenbeg and Skreeny River running North and parallel with the New Line Manorhamilton. Currently we are undertaking an Appropriate Assessment Screening Report (AASR) for the Scheme. It would be expected works would commence on site in Q1 2025.




