Who we are and why do we require your information?

Leitrim County Council seeks to promote the economic, social, and cultural development of Leitrim County and in doing so contribute significantly to improving the quality of life of its people. Why do we have a privacy statement?

Leitrim County Council has created this privacy statement in order to demonstrate our firm commitment to privacy and to assure you that in all your dealings with Leitrim Council that we will ensure the security of the data you provide to us. Leitrim County Council creates,



collects, and processes a significant amount of personal data in various multiple formats on a daily basis.

Leitrim County Council's commitment is that the personal data you may be required to supply to us is:

- Obtained lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner.
- Obtained for only specified, explicit and legitimate purposes.
- Adequate, relevant, and limited to what is necessary for purpose for which it was obtained.
- Recorded, stored accurately and securely and where necessary kept up to date.
- Kept only for as long as is necessary for the purposes for which it was obtained.
- Kept in a form which permits identification of the data subject.
- Processed only in a manner that ensures the appropriate security of the personal data including protection against unauthorised or unlawful processing.
