

PRIVACY STATEMENT for

Leitrim County Council PEACEPLUS Programme

Who are we?

Leitrim County Council (the Council) is the democratically elected unit of Local Government in County Leitrim and is responsible for providing a range of services to meet the economic, social and cultural needs of the people of our County. In order to provide the most effective and targeted services to meet the needs of the citizens, communities and businesses of County Leitrim we will be required to collect, process and use certain types of information about people and organisations. Depending on the service being offered, information sought may include 'personal data' as defined by the Data Protection Acts and the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and may relate to current, past and future service users; past; current and prospective employees; suppliers; and members of the public who may engage in communications with our staff. In addition, staff may be required, from time to time, to collect process and use certain types of personal data to comply with regulatory or legislative requirements or to carry out functions in the public interest.

Why do we have a Privacy Statement?

Leitrim County Council is the Data Controller for the delivery of the PEACEPLUS Programme in County Leitrim.

This privacy statement has been created to demonstrate the Council's commitment to you that personal data which you may be required to supply to us, to enable us to provide services, is;

- Obtained lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner
- Obtained for only specified, identified and legitimate purposes
- Processed for purposes which we have identified or purposes compatible with the purposes that we have identified.
- Adequate, relevant and limited to what is necessary for the purpose for which it was obtained
- Is collected and processed accurately and kept up to date (where necessary)
- Kept only for as long as is necessary for the purposes for which it was obtained.
- Processed in a manner that ensures the appropriate security of the personal data including protection against unauthorised or unlawful processing.

What is the activity referred to in this Privacy Statement?

This statement refers to the processing of personnel data by the Community Development Department in respect of:

- Data collected for the formation of the Leitrim PEACEPLUS Partnership Committee and facilitation of the Leitrim PEACEPLUS Partnership Committee, Partnership subcommittees and any Steering Committee meetings.
- Data collected for the purpose of the development and delivery of the PEACEPLUS
 Programme e.g. running reports on funding provided, attendance at
 events/activities/training, communicating information on upcoming meetings &
 events
- Special category data collected for the purposes of monitoring and evaluating PEACEPLUS programme activities.
- Photographs/audio/video footage may be recorded at public meetings & events and used for printed and online publicity, including social media.

What is the basis for making the processing of this personal data lawful?

Processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in Leitrim County Council in accordance with Article 6(1)(e) of the General Data Protection Regulation, 2016. Personal data of data subjects is processed only on consent from the data subject having been obtained in advance in accordance with Article 6(1)(a) of the General Data Protection Regulation, 2016. Where special Category Data is processed it will only be carried out with the explicit consent of the data subject and for one or more specified purposes, in accordance with Article 9(2)(a) of the General Data Protection Regulation, 2016.

Specifically, the lawful basis for the procedures is listed below

- Article 140 of REGULATION (EU) No. 1303/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council
- Section 46, Local Government Reform Act 2014
- Section 36(1)(a) of the Data Protection Act 2018 Explicit Consent

What categories of personal data is held by Leitrim County Council

- Personal data including names, addresses, email address, mobile phone numbers, nationality, age and gender.
- Special category data including race or ethnicity, religious or philosophical beliefs, political opinions physical or mental health, sexual orientation.
- Photographs/audio/video recordings



Is personal data submitted as part of this activity shared with other organisations?

The Council may, to fulfil statutory or regulatory obligations or in the public interest, from time to time, have to share personal data with other organisations or entities in Ireland and Northern Ireland. Where this is required, the Council shall have regard to your rights, to the security and integrity of the data and will minimise the data shared.

As part of the legal requirements of the PEACEPLUS programme, Leitrim County Council will share data with the Special European Union Programmes Body (SEUPB), who have oversight of the administration of the programme funding, for the purpose of monitoring and evaluating the PEACEPLUS programme.

Leitrim County Council and SEUPB will enter a Data Sharing Agreement to facilitate the sharing of personal data between both organisations.

How long is my data kept for?

The Council has a detailed record retention policy which outlines time periods for which your personal data will be retained and what will happen to it after the required retention period has expired.

In keeping with the terms of the PEACEPLUS programme, Leitrim County Council will retain personal data for a period of 5 years from 31 December of year in which final expenditure was submitted.

Do you need to update your records?

Leitrim County Council must take reasonable steps to ensure that personal data we have about our customers is correct and up to date. In addition, if the data held by us is found to be inaccurate you have the right to rectify/correct this.

If you find that personal data we have about you is inaccurate or needs to be updated (for instance, you may have changed your name, address, contact details etc.) then please contact us so that we can correct it. You can do this by:

When making a request to update your record please provide evidence to support this - for example a copy of a document containing your new address – utility (Gas, Electricity, Phone) bill etc.



Your rights:

You have the right to obtain confirmation as to whether data concerning you exists, to request access to personal data held about you, to be informed of the content and source of data and check its accuracy.

If the data held by us is found to be inaccurate you have the right to rectify/correct this – see above on how to update your records.

You also, subject to certain conditions being met, have the right to object to or seek restriction of the processing of personal data and to request the erasure of personal data held by the Council. You also have the right to data portability where technically feasible.

Please note that to help protect your privacy, we take steps to verify your identity before granting access to personal data.
