TOWN HALL BUILDING CARRICK ON SHANNON

Who are we?

Leitrim County Council (the Council) is the democratically elected unit of Local Government in County Leitrim and is responsible for providing a range of services to meet the economic, social and cultural needs of the people of our County. To provide the most effective and targeted services to meet the needs of the citizens, communities and businesses of County Leitrim we will be required to collect, process and use certain types of information about people and organisations. Depending on the service being offered, information sought may include 'personal data' as defined by the Data Protection Acts and the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and may relate to current, past and future service users; past; current and prospective employees; suppliers; and members of the public who may engage in communications with our staff. In addition, staff may be required, from time to time, to collect process and use certain types of personal data to comply with regulatory or legislative requirements or to carry out functions in the public interest.

Why do we have a Privacy Statement?

This privacy statement has been created to demonstrate the Council's commitment to you that personal data which you may be required to supply to us, to enable us to provide services, is;

- Obtained lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner
- Obtained for only specified, identified and legitimate purposes
- Processed for purposes which we have identified or purposes compatible with the purposes that we have identified.
- Adequate, relevant and limited to what is necessary for the purpose for which it was obtained
- Is collected and processed accurately and kept up to date (where necessary)
- Kept only for as long as is necessary for the purposes for which it was obtained.
- Processed in a manner that ensures the appropriate security of the personal data including protection against unauthorised or unlawful processing.

What is the activity referred to in this Privacy Statement?

Leitrim County Council have received funding through the Northern & Western Regional Assembly (NWRA) who are the Managing Authority for the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) Northern & Western Regional Programme 2021-2027. This funding was provided through the THRIVE – Town Centre First Heritage Revival Scheme – Application Strand 1. Under THRIVE Strand 1 Project 2024 Leitrim County Council secured funding to carry out a feasibility study to determine a future community end use of the Town Hall building, Carrick on Shannon, Co. Leitrim.

Public consultations will be carried out as part of this feasibility study to gain the views of the community and all stakeholders.

What is the basis for making the processing of this personal data lawful?

Processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in Leitrim County Council in accordance with Article 6(1)(a) & 6(1)(e) of the General Data Protection Regulation, 2016.

It is also necessary in accordance with Section 66(3) and Section 67 of the Local Government Act 2001 as an additional legal basis for carrying out the project.

What categories of personal data may be held by Leitrim County Council

No personal data will be collected from you however, you may provide personal data to us whilst requesting information of, or making submissions/observations on, the delivery of the Thrive Strand 1 Project 2024 on the Town Hall, Carrick on Shannon, Co. Leitrim.

Any personal data provided will be taken as freely given, specific, informed and an unambiguous indication of your consent to the processing of your personal data.

Data minimisation techniques will be always applied by the project team. Data provided may include name, address, Eircode, phone number, age range, email address.

Photographs/audio/video footage may be recorded at public meetings & events and used for printed and online publicity, including social media. Signage will be displayed at any events where photographs/audio/video footage are being taken/recorded.

Is personal data submitted as part of this activity shared with other organisations?

The Council may, to fulfil statutory or regulatory obligations or in the public interest, from time to time, must share personal data with other organisations or entities (in Ireland or



abroad). Where this is required, the Council shall have regard to your rights, to the security and integrity of the data and will minimise the data shared.

Data is **NOT** transferred to another country.

Submissions, Observations & Objections

Submissions/observations made as part of the delivery of the proposed THRIVE Strand 1 Project 2024 Town Hall, Carrick on Shannon will be considered by the project team.

How long is my data kept for?

In accordance with Article 82 pf Regulation (EU) 2021/1060, without prejudice to the rules governing State aid, the Beneficiary shall ensure that accounting records²⁴ and all supporting documents regarding expenditure, procurement, publicity, project selection, verification checks, declarations of expenditure and audits on the Project concerned are kept at an appropriate level for a 5-year period from 31 December of the year in which the last payment of the Grant Award to the Beneficiary is made.

The Council also has a detailed record retention policy which outlines time periods for which your personal data will be retained and what will happen to it after the required retention period has expired. A copy of Record Retention Policy can be accessed via the following link:

Do you need to update your records?

Leitrim County Council must take reasonable steps to ensure that personal data we have about our customers is correct and up to date.

When making a request to update your record please provide evidence to support this for example a copy of a document containing your new address – utility (Gas, Electricity, Phone) bill etc.

Your rights:

You have the right to obtain confirmation as to whether data concerning you exists, to request access to personal data held about you, to be informed of the content and source of data and check its accuracy.

If the data held by us is found to be inaccurate you have the right to rectify/correct this – see above on how to update your records.

You also, subject to certain conditions being met, have the right to object to or seek restriction of the processing of personal data and to request the erasure of personal data held by the Council. You also have the right to data portability where technically feasible.

Please note that to help protect your privacy, we take steps to verify your identity before granting access to personal data.
