THE FUTURE OF BALLINAMORE COURTHOUSE - CALL FOR FEEDBACK

Ballinamore Development Company has commissioned a Feasibility Study to explore viable options for the development of Ballinamore Courthouse. This study aims to enhance the building's social and economic value for the community, including the potential incorporation of a John McGahern cultural experience, scaled appropriately based on research findings.

The study is being conducted by a multidisciplinary team led by Dr Eileen McGloin (EMcG Solutions), with support from Eamonn Monaghan (Keys and Monaghan Architects) and Gavin Duignan (Kelly O'Callaghan Surveyors). Their combined expertise ensures a practical yet forward-thinking approach to the project.

Ballinamore to Corgar Greenway - Post Storm Update

This remains a fantastic amenity for everyone in the community and after the recent storm volunteers came out to clear it of debris and fallen trees. The council will be urged to fulfil their role in maintaining it.

Corgar to Aughawillan Greenway nearly complete

The Contractor will be on site in the next few weeks to complete the final part of the greenway to Aughawillan. Cavan County Council will then be responsible for finishing the piece from Aughawillan to Ballyheady, which will link to Ballyconnell.

South Leitrim Greenway

€100,000 in funding has just been allocated the first phase of this project involving consultation on routes. Potentials include Dromod to Mohill to Ballinamore, Ballinamore to Ballyduff to Keshcarrigan to Kilclare, which will link to Leitrim Village.

News from the new Ballinamore Biodiversity Gardening Group (BBGG)

The Ballinamore Biodiversity Gardening Group (BBGG) formed last autumn following completion of MSLETB Horticultural Modules. Their aims are to inspire, engage and educate themselves and the community to live sustainably harmoniously with nature to preserve diversity of all life.

Their Apple-pressing Day last year brought in new people from the wider area. In conjunction with Tidy Towns and in collaboration with CE scheme workers they will enhance local biodiversity by planting native trees, shrubs, perennials and edibles and by strategic seasonal mowing. There are talks planned on a various subjects, including on bats and the importance of healthy soil. They are planning projects aimed at helping swifts, solitary bees & the waterside birds. Ballinamore Area Community Council goes from strength to strength in its 50th Year

In 2024 BACC drew down €900,000 in grant funding with which they plan to:

Upgrade the sports complex, build a new multiple use games area (MUGA), extend the children's playground to include a disability swing & sensory items, insulate the Den and install solar panels & EV charger, provide FREE training such as Safe Pass, QUAD driving, Forklift, Driving lessons, continue running "Better Together - Níos Fearr Le Chéile" Peace Impact Programme, extend services provided by the community services hub in the Den, take ownership of Felim's Pitch, upgrade the Enterprise Units on the Golf Links Road.





Ballinamore Comhaltas Hosts the Leitrim County Fleadh Friday - Sunday 25-27th April

In addition to hosting the competitions, Ballinamore Comhaltas has organised a session trail on Friday, Saturday and Sunday night in local pubs as well as a concert at the Island Theatre on Friday 25th by renowned musicians Cian Sweeney, Dylan Carlos and John McCartin.
